Summary

Jeremy is a leading barrister with expertise in commercial, insolvency, relationship property, equity and trust law. As part of his practice he also often undertakes discreet work for high profile individuals and families.

Jeremy has previously appeared in significant tax cases including acting in *Cullen Group Ltd v Commissioner of Inland Revenue* (2018) 28 NZTC 23-058, (2019) NZTC 24-003.

Since joining the Bar Jeremy has been recognised by the Chambers Asia-Pacific 2022, 2023 and 2024 legal guides being ranked as Band 2 most recently.
